President's Message

A very interesting article was on the K-State website recently about a research project to enhance marbling in beef cattle. Brad Johnson from Texas Tech and other researchers from Texas Tech, Texas A & M, and University of Idaho have been working on a five year study to better understand marbling development by fatty acids in beef cattle. Johnson began work on the project while at Kansas State University and the study is funded by the Kansas Beef Council through Beef Checkoff funds.

Johnson states, "We know marbling increases the palatability of beef, the juiciness and indirectly increases tenderness....in feedlot cattle, starch from corn and grain sorghum in the diet elevates levels of <u>oleic acid</u>, which is a monounsaturated fatty acid." The research team also thinks that oleic acid stimulates marbling in cattle. Johnson also cited work by Texas A & M that shows oleic acid is hearthealthy and positive for human health. If oleic acid is positively correlated to more marbling and to positive human health, then it is a win-win situation for the beef cattle industry!!!
